
Ramacciotti is married to the former Marjorie Honsinger of East Alburg and has live in that part of the county for the last five years.


EDITORIAL

The Cyclops is or was a mythilogical beast now presumed to be extinct (if he ever lived at all). The Cyclops is best known for the fact that it had but one large eye in the center of its forehead, which would probably have been O.K., except that having this single large eye instead of two regular ones, accurate preception of the world and its events was extremly difficult for the poor Cyclops. While there does seem to be quite a bit of evidence that a real Cyclops never existed, one is frequently reminded of the things that this beast might well have left behind. These reminders seem to increase in number about three or four months before an election when one may 'see any number of politicians become afflicted with the rare "I" Disease known as Cyclops I-dis (or I-dat, or more often both I-dis and I-dat).

It seems that each political season a goodly amount of politicians fall victim to this

South Hero July 4th Parade






South Hero played host to one of the two parades held in the county this July 4th.
