Steady & Ramacciotti To Run

Bernard Steady of South Hero has announced his candidacy for representative from Grand Isle-Franklin district #1. Steady, a Democrat will be seeking one of the two representative seats from the district which is composed of the towns of Alburg, Isle La Motte, North Hero, Grand Isle, South Hero, Georgia and a small sliver of the town of Milton.

Steady, who is a veteran of both World War II and the Korean Conflict, was born and educated in Milton and has resided in Grand Isle County for the past 27 years. The father of seven children, Steady is currently a member of the South Hero School Board, the South Hero Planning Committee and the Franklin-Grand Isle County Regional Planning and Development Commission. He is also chairman of both the South Hero and the Grand Isle County Democratic Committees.

Steady is employed by I.B.M. of Essex Junction as a Quality assurance inspector, a position he has held for some 17 years.

John Ramacciotti of East Alburg has announced his candidacy for the Vermont House of Representatives from Grand Isle-Franklin County District #1. Ramacciotti will seek one of the two seats from the district as a Democrat.

Ramacciotti, the proprietor of Brande's Pizza Parlor in East Alburg is currently a member of the Alburg Planning Board and is a Justice of the Peace. He is also a member of the Alburg Sno Springers, the local snowmobile club.

Ramacciotti is married to the former Marjorie Honsinger of East Alburg and has lived in that part of the county for the last five years.

EDITORIAL

The Cyclops is or was a mythological beast now presumed to be extinct (if he ever lived at all). The Cyclops is best known for the fact that it had but one large eye in the center of its forehead, which would probably have been O.K., except that having this single large eye instead of two regular ones, accurate preception of the world and its events was extremely difficult for the poor Cyclops. While there does seem to be quite a bit of evidence that a real Cyclops never existed, one is frequently reminded of the things that this beast might well have left behind. These reminders seem to increase in number about three or four months before an election when one may see any number of politicians become afflicted with the rare "I" Disease known as Cyclops I-dis (or I-dat, or more often both I-dis and I-dat).

It seems that each political season a goodly amount of politicians fall victim to this

As a matter of fact they are quite apt to be the first to point out the I-sores of their opponents, while all they will give the voters are I-rate answers when questioned about their own illness,

Alas, we are starting another political season and even here in the county we have a few victims of the Cyclops Syndrom, who will seek office. Victims who would rather be I-rate, than representative of the people who make up Grand Isle County. For me, as for most of the county's population the islands seem a fine place to live at present and i hope that WE, after this year's election, will remain pleased with OUR islands, rather than disgruntled by some politician's I-lands.

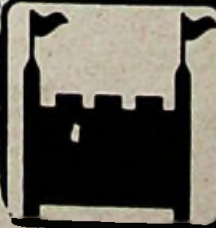

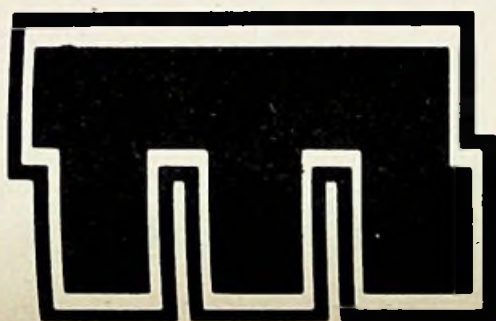

3 County 4-H Groups To Attend E. States

Three County 4-H Groups were selected at State 4-H Day in early June to represent Grand Isle County at the Eastern States Exposition in the Youth-Arama Program in September.

Achieving this recognition were "Little Sisters", a physical fitness group from Grand Isle led by Mrs. Joseph Laferriere; "Creating with Leather", a craft group from Grand Isle led by Mrs. Willis Griggs, and "Rewards of Dairy Life", a 4-H Dairy Group from South Hero and Alburg led by Mrs. Dwight Moody of Alburg.

Other groups which represented the county at State 4-H Day were the Mod Podge Squad, a craft group from South Hero led by Mrs. Hank Robinson; the County 4-H Dress Review, led by Mrs. Michael Potter, Deborah Lane and others; the North Hero Physical Fitness group led by Mrs. James Martin and "Lost, Strayed or Stolen", a 4-H dairy group from Grand Isle led by Mrs. George Sorrell Jr.

All of the groups did an excellent job with their Action Exhibits at both the County 4-H night and the State 4-H Day in Barre.

Discussion Set

Dr. E. B. Henson of the University of Vermont department of zoology, chairman of the Lake Champlain Studies Center for the past 10 years, will speak on "Knowing Lake Champlain, Its Problems and Future," at a public meeting at the Grand Isle School August 9th at 7:30pm.

There will be no admission charge to the session sponsored by the Grand Isle Town Association.

Henson will discuss sources of pollution, the lake level and other phases, and will supplement his talk with slides. He recently returned from a trip to Poland and will leave soon for Saskatchewan, studying pollution and related matters.
